1. Log into [Canvas](#) (web version)
2. Select the course

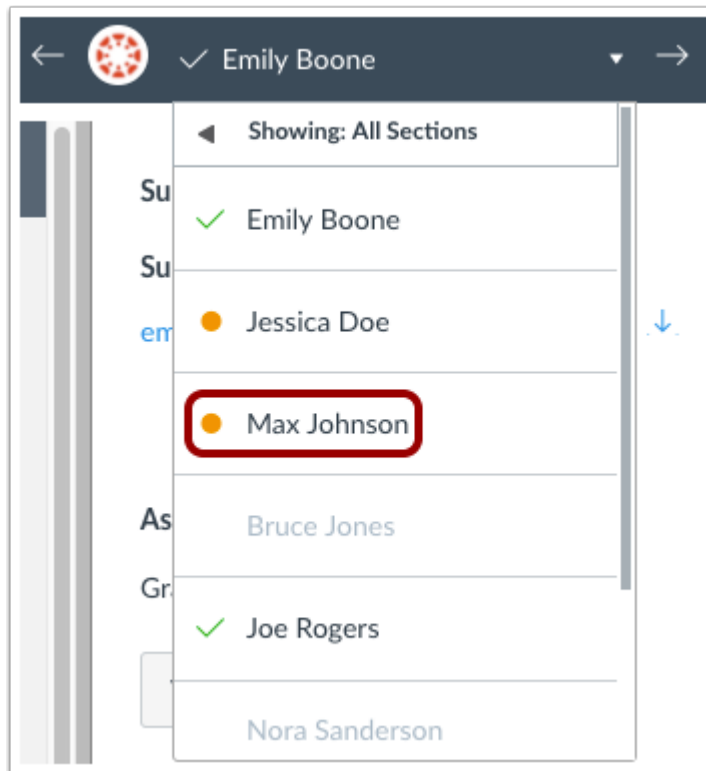

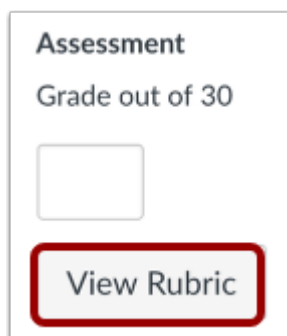
3. Navigate to **Assignments**
4. Select the desired assignment






5. Open **Speedgrader**
6. Locate student submissions by clicking the dropdown



7. Once you have selected the student submission, click **View Rubric**



8. To resize the rubric window, click and drag the sizing column horizontally. You may need to scroll horizontally and vertically to view the entire rubric.

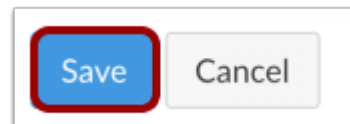
[4] Type the value into the **Points** (pts) field [4]. You can manually enter points
